
Why travel as a middle school student?



Monthly Payment Plan Benefits

- Automatic deduction from your checking account each month. Approximately \$250/month for students and \$275/month for adults.
- No late fees
- Final payment deadline up to30 days prior to departure
- Other payment options are available

What is included?

- Round trip airfare from Spokane
- Lodging in Hotels
 - Students: 2 to 5 per room depending on location (students with students)
 - Adults: 2 per room (adults with adults)
- Transportation throughout the trip from MMS back to MMS
- Explorica tour director to guide us on the ground
- Breakfast and dinner daily
- Guided sightseeing/walking tours
- Entrance fees to selected attractions







What is **not** included?

- > \$50 for two pre-trip team building activities at Paradise Ridge Challenge Course
- Lunches, beverages, and snacks throughout the day
- Passport fees
- > Souvenirs
- Additional airline baggage fees
- Phone calls and/or internet café access
- We recommend \$500 for addition expenses.


- Group Fundraisers

Four Steps

- 1. Complete an application and return it to one of the trip leaders ASAP (see application due date on top of the application Friday, November 20th at 3:00 pm).
- 2. Wait for a confirmation email from the trip leaders on Saturday, November 21st.
- Once your application is accepted, complete the online instructions to enroll and pay your non-refundable \$194 (\$50 sign up plus \$144 required Insurance fee) This must be completed by 3:00 pm Friday, December 4th.
- 4. Attend all group meetings.

Selection Process



Selection criteria are as follows:

- 1. Completeness and professionalism of application
- 2. Strength of application answers
- 3. Probability of success while abroad



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Can adults/parents go?
 - > Yes, applications are available tonight. Usually one parent per student.
- Can a younger or older sibling go?
 - > This trip is for current 5th to 8th grade students only.
- When will this trip depart and return?
 - We typically leave the week after school gets out in June. Our official dates are released three months prior to departure.
- > Can a relative go on the trip?
 - They must complete an adult application and meet the age requirements of 21.
- What if I cannot pay the full trip cost?
 - Once you commit to this trip you are obligated to pay your way.
 - There are penalties for early withdrawal.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Dietary options?

Explorica does have different meal options depending on individual needs.

> Medications while abroad?

Students are responsible for all needed medications (please notify trip leaders of ANY medical issues prior to the trip).





Participant Selection Timeline

- > November 2nd Parent meeting and applications are out
- November 20th Applications are DUE by 3:30 PM and will be reviewed by the trip leaders
- > November 21st Acceptance letters are sent out electronically
- ➤ **December 4th** Accepted travelers must be enrolled online with Explorica by 3:00 pm and have paid the non-refundable \$50 fee plus required insurance \$144 (\$194).
- ➤ **December 4th 3:00 pm** Accepted applicants who are not enrolled will lose their spot to an alternate who will be informed by Dec 5th.
- December 10th 3:00 pm Alternate travelers must be signed up with Explorica
- December 14th 1st all group meeting 7:00 MPR
